

In March 2023, the most important phase of the consultation process for the feasibility study of the European Digital Competence Certificate (EDSC) was launched. This is the last survey planned and we expect a wide participation from all stakeholders!

The survey aims to understand the potential demand for an EDSC, the needs and gaps in the current digital competence certification ecosystem, the expected value and potential benefits of an EDSC, and to identify the key requirements for an EDSC.

EU Policies on Digital Education



Council Recommendations on Provision of digital skills in education and training and on Enabling factors in digital education

According to recent announcements, two key proposals on digital education: for a Council Recommendation on enabling factors for digital education and for a Council Recommendation on the provision of digital skills in education and training, will be published following the planned adoption by the College of Commissioners on 18 April 2023, fittingly during the first week of the ALL DIGITAL Weeks campaign.

Both files, however, have a quite strong focus on formal education, particularly in secondary education settings. The final negotiations and adoption of the final texts by the European Council will be facilitated by the Spanish Presidency of the Council, which is succeeding the current presidency held by Sweden in the latter half of the year.

The DAISSy Research Group of the Hellenic Open University finalized its activities on XENIA european project on Higher Education (HE) Inclusiveness Índex.

The 'XENIA: Higher Education (HE) Inclusiveness Index' has been a three-year ERASMUS+ project that developed an innovative and integrated tool to support European higher education institutions -HEIsin evaluating the actual level of inclusiveness of their environment and identifying any efforts that can be placed to best address the needs of LGBT+ people and ensure the protection of their fundamental rights and academic opportunities.

The DAISSy Research Group of the HOU has been the Greek partner, implementing actions on promoting EDI principles in national HEIs and supporting all project Deliverables.



2BDIGITAL supports the effective digital teaching and learning experience of VET teachers and learners, especially those at-risk of dropout and early leaving, by adapting to the digital transition magnified by COVID-19, in an attempt to avoid the increase of inequalities in

DIGIVID: Digital competencies for teachers – Curriculum and platform now available

The DIGIVID Erasmus+ project has now released the final version of its curriculum. The curriculum, based on DigComp 2.1 and DigCompEdu, includes resources for learning about basic digital competences, examples of digital methods and tools that can be applied in class, knowledge about digital life, worlds of youth, and tips for inclusion and accessibility.

The curriculum is accessed through the Moodle-based DIGIVID platform. **DIGIVID** helps teachers in going through the curriculum at their own pace, keep track of their progress, and reflect on how they can use what they learn in their practice.

Unleash girls' creativITy with technology

ALL DIGITAL members Hellenic University from Greece, Simbioza from Slovenia together with other partners in Lithuania (RIAP association, Information Technology Institute) and Portugal (Polytechnic Institute of Tomar) are running a two-year Erasmus-funded project: **Empower Girls** Creativity through the use of Digital Technologies (SparkDigiGirls).

This winter a new online program Unleash CreativITy with Technology was launched in five languages: English, Slovenian, Lithuanian, Portuguese, and Greek. The program aims to support girls age 14+ to uncover creative and innovative problem-solving in different daily life situations with the help of digital technologies such as AR, AI, Cloud Computing, 3D modeling & printing, Blockchain, etc. More information about the project could be found here.

DIGITAL4LIB - Skills to increase the resilience of librarians and adult volunteers involved in the digital transformation

Starting from 01.11.2021, ANBPR has coordinated for a period of 18 months an Erasmus+ initiative consisting of mobility of learners and staff in adult education. Through this project, ANBPR aimed at equipping 15 employees and volunteers from the network of public libraries in Romania with technological and resilience skills to become more responsible.

Through the 3 mobility flows (two structured courses delivered by specialized providers from Slovenia and the Czech Republic and a Job Shadowing session, hosted by ALL DIGITAL, B), the DIGITAL4LIB project improved the situation of the participants regarding the set of skills, abilities and behaviors of adults in fields such as Learning Digital Competencies, Game-Based Learning and Gamification, but also in the area of exploring innovative methods of organizing events, designing impact campaigns, organizational strategies and advocacy measures for increasing the role of technology in the training of digital transformation e-facilitators and promoters of an effective and innovative digital pedagogy.




