



Three and a half years ago ALL DIGITAL member association LANGAS ATEITJ and partners launched the project "Connected Lithuania: an Efficient, Secure and Responsible Lithuanian Digital Community" (Connected Lithuania) and set an ambitious goal - to help the LT population to improve their digital skills and learn to use ICT and the Internet efficiently, safely and responsibly. At the finish line the project

achieved delightful results - more than 104 thousand adults of LT voluntarily attended the courses to improve their digital skills. Overall, over 500 thousand people participated in all project activities. Learn more.

AMeLiE training for trainers on how to tackle online hate speech


